Eylat Poliner: Thanks for helping with Karl Lembke's storage—Michelle Pincus, Rob Powell, Susan Fox, Gene Turnbow, and Charlie. There will be some more. Hoping to complete this by the end of March or April, depending on helpers' availability and school schedule. Lembke would have been proud.

Loscon 50: It is January, and we need to start consideration. We can appoint a chair before we have a new contract. Contract negotiations will be after Gallifrey One. Jason will be working with volunteers Chris and Burt Boden. Club president should bring this up at weekly meetings. Deadline for submitting bids for the 2024 Loscon (Loscon 50) is Feb. 25.
