After playing a brief game in which LASFSans identified various sound effects, Raiklen walked the club through seven decades of TV, movie, and video game sound. He addressed the repeated use of cues, sound effects as leitmotifs, the Cookerly organ, and the various composers who worked on the series.

LASFSans asked questions about the lyrics Gene Roddenbery wrote to "Theme from *Star Trek*," John Willams, the phaser sound effect, Gerald Fried's underscore from the *Star Trek* episode "Amok Time," and other topics.


