MonSFFA is moving back downtown to a *new* meeting hall!

We'll be meeting in "Salle Maisonneuve" of Le Nouvel Hotel! Le Nouvel is located on a major bus line, and is just a short walk from either Metro Guy/Concordia or Lucien-L'Allier. This new locale is only one block west of our pre-pandemic meeting place, the Hôtel Espresso (corner Guy and René-Lévesque)!

MonSFFA MOVES BACK DOWNTOWN TO NEW MEETING HALL!

MonSFFA has opted to end its relationship with the Lachine Legion, site of our monthly meetings these past six months or so, and relocate to a new meeting hall. The club is moving *back downtown*, to Le Nouvel Hotel on Boul. René-Lévesque Ouest! This new meeting space is located just

one block west of our former downtown locale, the Hôtel Espresso (corner Guy and René-Lévesque)! Those of us who've been around

for a few years will remember Le Nouvel Hotel as the site of a couple of the club's ConCept SF/F conventions, circa early-1990s. So MonSFFen are certainly familiar with the neighbourhood and shouldn't have any trouble finding us again after so long an absence!

OUR NEW MEETING LOCALE

Le Nouvel's address is 1740 Boul. René-Lévesque Ouest, corner St-Mathieu.

Beginning with our March 9 meeting, we will be gathering in "Salle Maisonneuve," one of several conference rooms located on the ground floor of the facility's south tower. From the hotel's lobby, walk down to the end of the long "glass hallway," then veer left to arrive on the conference floor; Maisonneuve is just past the washrooms.

GETTING THERE

Le Nouvel is easily accessible by car or public transit.

The Guy Street off-ramp (Exit 3) from the eastbound Ville Marie Expressway (HW136) lets out on René-Lévesque, a major Montreal thoroughfare. From there it's a short drive east a block or two to the hotel. Drivers arriving from above René-Lévesque may take St-Mathieu south to the intersection with René-Lévesque; the hotel is on the south-east corner of the intersection. Street parking is available in the area, but of course, it's somewhat limited. The Nouvel offers underground paid parking, however, just as did our former downtown locale, the Espresso.

HAVE YOU PAID YOUR ANNUAL MonSFFA MEMBERSHIP FEES?

The COVID-19 pandemic disrupted the club's normal operation for more than three years! During this period, our regular in-person meetings were suspended, and the payment of annual fees were deferred. The club has now begun again collecting those annual membership fees, this in order to return to a positive cash flow situation, and so cover the monthly costs of renewed operations.

Major bus routes run along René-Lévesque, and the hotel is within a 10- or 15-minute walk from either the Guy/Concordia or Lucien-L'Allier Metro station.

ZOOM-CHATS AT MEETINGS WILL CONTINUE

We do not wish to abandon our loyal, out-of-town and online-favouring club members, who effectively kept MonSFFA going through the pandemic years, so we will *continue* to hold our hybrid meetings, combining live, in-person events with an online component. Be assured, then, that the Nouvel get-togethers will include ZOOMchats so as to allow MonSFFen online to participate.

We are also thinking about scheduling our winter meetings as ZOOM-only events in order to save on operating costs (and skirt any nasty weather!); stay tuned.

THE MonSFFA SNACK TABLE WILL NOT!

Because the Nouvel offers banquet services as part of their business model, any food or drink served during our meetings *must* be provided by them. Period. This is standard practise at pretty much all hotels. Thus, not so much as a box of Timbits or bag of chips may be brought onto the Nouvel's conference floor! This means that we will no longer be able to set up our own snacks-and-softdrinks corner. The long-established MonSFFA Snack Bar is now history; all good things...

The Nouvel, meanwhile, has kindly cut us a special deal so as to reduce their usual rental fee to something we can reasonably afford while at the same time supplying us with coffee and cookies during our meetings!

WHY WE ARE MOVING BACK DOWNTOWN

There are a number of factors that ultimately prompted our move back downtown to a new meeting hall, but before we get into all of that, it might be helpful to know why we left in the first place.

The short answer is: money. In 2019, we learned that our meeting location of many years, the Hôtel Espresso, was shifting away from meeting-room rentals and repurposing its function space for other uses. We found ourselves looking for a new home. Problem was, the very favourable arrangement we had nurtured with the Espresso over time was simply out of the question at the other downtown hotels we scouted. There was just no getting around that. And, the prices we were quoted for renting space consistently exceeded what our budget would responsibly allow. Community centers and church basements, of which there were *precious few*, and fewer still able to accommodate us, proved a dead-end. We concluded that a move outside of the downtown area remained our only viable option.

But before we could establish ourselves in a new suburban meeting hall, the pandemic blew up and, effectively, interrupted and delayed plans for what turned out to be over three years! Unable to physically meet as we always had due to public health restrictions, MonSFFA, during this period, adapted by instituting a series of online "e-meetings," including ZOOM-chats, accessible via the club's Website. These virtual gettogethers sustained the club through the pandemic, and months of lingering anxiety afterwards.

When we were finally able to return to live, in-person



meetings, we opted to get together at a branch of the Royal Canadian Legion in the West-Island suburb of Lachine—the club did not wish to extend our dearth of in-person events any further than necessary. Despite the new venue's distance from the downtown hotel to which we had been accustomed, the area seemed reasonably well served by public transit.

In hindsight, maybe it was not. While we recognize that post-pandemic anxieties and the changes wrought by this "New Normal" could also be at play, here, one of the reasons we are now returning to the downtown area centers on difficulties some MonSFFen have reported travelling to Lachine by public transit in reasonable time. The Metro/bus ride downtown four years ago was rather more direct and not so prolonged as is the trip to Lachine today. And, indeed, we have noted a dip in the number of those physically present at our meetings since we began getting together at the Lachine Legion.

Foremost of the reasons for our return downtown, however, is the Legion's way of conducting business, which we soon found to be in marked opposition to the club's expectations. Almost immediately, and without prior notice, a "bar fee" was added to the price we had negotiated for rental of the meeting room. We had not requested that the bar be opened during our meetings, but nevertheless, it was, and the bartender, apparently, had to be paid, preferably in cash, no less! That bar fee was soon increased to the point where any savings we had managed by moving out of the downtown area were now erased. The financial argument for abandoning the downtown area has evaporated!

Most problematic, however, was the Legion's seeming inability to properly communicate with us, and to book and confirm our room more than a month in advance, despite our requesting of them, both verbally and in writing, several months of dates, and alternate dates. Frustratingly, sometimes we didn't know for certain if we actually had the room reserved until a week, or even a few days before the scheduled meeting was to take place! This made it near-impossible for us to properly plan meetings or book guest speakers.

Without casting aspersions on the Legion, who clearly have their own, unique internal procedures, regrettably, it seems their customary way of doing things simply does not mesh smoothly with our needs and expectations. In the end, unfortunately, things just didn't work out as well as we had hoped.

And so do we part company, with our thanks proffered for their hospitality and efforts on our behalf.

RETURN OF THE CLUB'S SCI-FI BOOK SALE

We expect to, *at long last*, hold our fund-raising Sci-Fi Book Sale in the fall—the Executive is currently discussing an October or November date; stay tuned. Le Nouvel will serve well as the site of the book sale, not the least reason of which is that it's just a block away from the familiar former site of the sale, so patrons should have no trouble finding us. After some five years absence, the book sale, we are given to understand, has been sorely missed.
